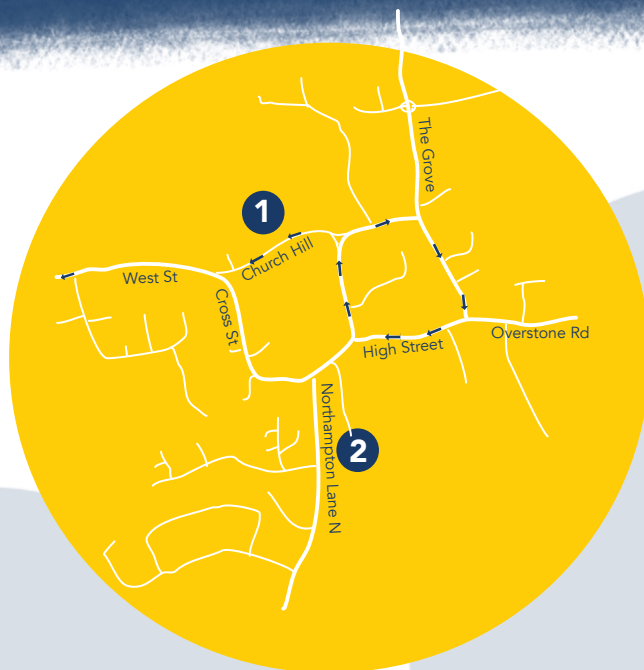


Directions

The Speaker

Kirsten left the world of consumer research 13 years ago, to combine the Cornhill Training Course with the ministry trainee scheme at Trinity Church Islington. She spent 11 years as a full-time women's worker at Trinity. Since September 2024 she's still at Trinity half of her week and the other half she's working for the Proclamation Trust as Assistant Director of Women's Ministry. And when she's not doing that she can often be found cycling with friends, baking or entertaining her godchildren.
